Instructions

This assessment involves writing an academic essay answering the question below.

"Evaluate the role of the UNSC in resolving conflict during the Cold War period. Include <u>three</u> specific issues during the Cold War period to support your argument".

This essay needs to be 1500 words +/-10% but no greater.

It needs to be in essay format. You may not use headings and subheadings, but you must write in paragraphs using PEEAL. Dot points are also not acceptable. You need to be writing in academic language.

You must use the scaffold that will be provided to you. This can be found in the assessment tile on Study Smart.

There is an <u>optional</u> submission of an essay plan. This needs to be submitted before Friday 22nd September at 11:59pm. No other drafts will be looked at and you must use the template provided.

As well as using content covered in class, you must research and find evidence to support your argument.

- You must use at least <u>one</u> academic resource available through the College library.
- All of your other resources can come from other online academic sources.
- You must include at least <u>five</u> academic resources in total in your reference list which you have specifically used in your essay.
- These resources must be referenced using APA7 and there must be a reference list and intext references.

Your essay will be checked by Turnitin. It is suggested that you submit 4 days before the due date to check your similarity so that you can make any necessary changes. Your similarity percentage must be 10% or under.

Academic Integrity

Interim GAIT, (Generative artificial Intelligence Tools) policy

The college's values around academic integrity remains robust and while GAITs such as Chat GPT are becoming increasingly available, this does not detract from the fact that student's work must be their own and where the use of GAITs like ChatGPT have been permitted by the subject head, they must be properly credited, and your submissions must be substantially your own work. If the course teacher suspects

that GAITs have been used and have not been cited, an academic penalty will be applied. Further, if the course teacher suspects that the work is not the student's own work, penalties will also apply.

The use of GAITs, (Generative Artificial Intelligence Tools) is not permitted in this subject. If the course teacher suspects that GAITs have been used academic penalties will be applied as per the breach of academic integrity policy. The use of GAITs aligns with the penalty imposed for contract cheating.

Late Submission Penalty

Assessment tasks submitted after the due date will be subject to a penalty unless prior approval for an extension of time to submit the assessment has been granted in writing by the relevant Program Manager (or delegate), or mitigating circumstances apply. For every calendar day up to and including five calendar days after the due date, a penalty of 10% of the maximum awardable marks will be applied to late work. The penalty will be calculated by first marking the work, and then subtracting 10% of the maximum awardable mark for each calendar day after the due date. For work submitted more than five calendar days after the due date a mark of zero will be awarded.
